Rescheduled Regular Meeting
August 7, 2025
7:00 P.M.

The regular monthly meeting of the Meyersdale Borough Council was called to order by President Irwin, August 7, 2025 at 7:00 P.M. The meeting was rescheduled from August 12, 2025 to August 7, 2025 due to the lack of a quorum of Council Members being available on August 12, 2025.

Mr. Ackerman, Mr. Baer, Mr. Irwin, Mrs. Knieriem, and Mr. Smith were present. Solicitor Valentine was present via phone. Mr. Baker, Mrs. Gnagey, Mayor Smith and Junior Council Member Baker were absent. Brion Reiber – Street Foreman, was absent. Officer Craig was present.

MINUTES:

There was some discussion regarding the motion made at the July 8, 2025 meeting to amend the June 10, 2025 meeting minutes. Solicitor Valentine reported that minutes are only legally allowed to be amended or altered if there is a grammatical error or if something did not happen. Statements that are made by guests cannot be amended or altered. The minutes must reflect what was said, therefore the July 8, 2025 motion must be rescinded. Mr. Ackerman made the motion to rescind the motion made at the July 8, 2025 meeting to amend the June 10, 2025 meeting minutes, Page 8, Item H). Meeting Minutes. Mr. Smith seconded. Motion passed. Mrs. Knieriem clarified that the NO vote she cast at the July 29, 2025 Special Meeting regarding the family restroom was that she is in favor of a family restroom, just not in the ladies restroom area.

Mrs. Knieriem made the motion to approve the minutes of the July 8, 2025 Regular Meeting with the correction and the July 29, 2025 Special Meeting with the clarification. Mr. Ackerman seconded. Motion passed.

FINANCIAL REPORT/ BILLS:

The financial report was presented by the Borough Secretary in the absence of Mr. Baker. Mr. Baer made the motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills as presented. Mr. Smith seconded. Motion passed.

- **Police Pension Plan Investment Policy, Funding Policy Statement and Authorized Signatures**
Mrs. Knieriem made the motion to accept the Police Pension Investment Policy, Funding Policy Statement as presented by Somerset Trust Company and to authorize the President of Council, Finance Chairman and the Borough Secretary as authorized signers for the account. Mr. Baer seconded. Motion passed with Mr. Ackerman abstaining. (See attached abstention memorandum).
- **Replace decorative street lamp on upper Main St.**
Mrs. Knieriem made the motion to accept the quote to replace the decorative street lamp at a cost of \$1,665.58. Mr. Ackerman seconded. Motion passed.
- **Committee meeting**
President Irwin reported that the Committee Meetings will be reinstated beginning September 4, 2025. The meetings will be held on the Thursday prior to the Regular Meeting and will be held at 7 PM.

- **Financial information request**

President Irwin asked if Mrs. Gnagey had reviewed the financial information that she had requested. The Secretary reported that Mrs. Gnagey did not review the information to date. Solicitor Valentine informed Council that this information must be reviewed in the office and that it cannot be distributed via hardcopy or electronically.

GUESTS:

A.) Mrs. Kayla Robertson was present to request the use of the gym for homeschool gym class. The class would be every Friday from 10:00 AM – 12:30 PM. (See attached regarding the Home School program)

Mr. Baer made the motion to approve the request, and not to charge for the use of the gym. Mrs. Knieriem seconded. Motion passed.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

A.) Mr. Brian Witherite was present to report that the information Mrs. Gnagey reported on at the July 8, 2025 meeting regarding ATV state routes within the Borough as being open is incorrect. He has spoken to officials in Hollidaysburg and was informed that they have received an application from Meyersdale Borough, but it has not been approved. There are several blocks on the application that are specific to law enforcement.. There needs to be an engineer report and a traffic study completed. PennDOT has a concern with the monument area. As of August 7, 2025, PennDOT has not given the green light to officially open the State highways to ATV traffic.

B.) Ms. Deb Fisher was present with questions and a comment as follows:

Q. Should the Borough Secretary be a signer on the Police Pension Plan, since Mr. Ackerman abstained due to being a recipient of the pension plan?

A. The Borough Secretary is not a policy maker and does not make any decision pertaining to the plan. Her role as a signer would be for correspondence only.

Comment:

Mrs. Gnagey should be given grace for not reviewing the documents, because her sister had passed away.

C.) Mr. Robert Munion, 222 Olinger Street was present to report that he is a candidate for Borough Council and the he has been viewing the meetings via YouTube. He has a concern with how the President of Council has spoken to other Council Members and he had a concern with how the public is treated. If he is elected in November he also has a concern as to how he will be treated as a member of Council. He indicated that it was obvious at the Special Meeting what was done to Mrs. Gnagey regarding the family restroom being put in an area that was never talked about. His observation was that the President of Council has a dislike for Mrs. Gnagey and that is very unprofessional. He thinks that the President of Council should resign. He feels that if one person is going to be treated with disrespect then all the members should be treated with disrespect. He indicated that Mrs. Gnagey is hated by members of Council. Mr. Munion does not know Mrs. Gnagey, but that she is a friend and the treatment towards her by Council Members is inappropriate. He thinks that Council needs to put their personal feelings aside and do what is best for the community.

President Irwin held his response to Mr. Munion until the President's Report.

D) Mrs. Ashley Bird, Large St. was present to apologize for the report that her neighbor had given to Council at

the July 8, 2025 meeting. Mrs. Bird reported that everything is in order to install the fence, a permit was obtained and she has a written agreement to attach the fence to an existing fence owned by an adjacent property owner.

PRESIDENT’S REPORT:

President Irwin disagreed with a number of things that Mr. Munion said. The President’s Report was emphasized on the public comment policy. When public comment is over, no other discussion from guests should occur. At the July meeting, there were individuals that were absolutely out of control, they did not pay any attention to him trying to run the meeting. The President is responsible for running the meeting and keeping order during the meeting. It states in the public comment policy that Council Members do not have to speak or answer any question. President Irwin does not think that he has ever degraded anyone during public comment time. President Irwin read from sections of the Public Comment Policy that was adopted by Council. (See complete policy attached)

Section I. OPEN PUBLIC COMMENT subsection B., D., and F. were read aloud.

President Irwin indicated that contrary to subsection D., Council responds to questions or issues that are raised by the public, during the public comment period.

President Irwin respected the comments made by Mr. Munion, and his opinion of how the meeting is ran, however he will not resign as President of Council, just because Mr. Munion thinks he should.

President Irwin has lived in Meyersdale his entire life, has served on numerous Boards and organizations and has risen to the leadership position on all of them.

The last two meetings in July were completely out of control, against the adopted policy and these types of actions will not continue going forward. Section III. REGULAR AGENDA was also read aloud.

MAYOR’S REPORT:

No report was given due to the absence of Mayor Smith.

JUNIOR COUNCIL MEMBER:

No report is given during the summer months.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR:

No report was given.

ENGINEER’S REPORT:

No report was given.

SOLICITOR’S REPORT:

Solicitor Valentine reported on the following:

- Army Corp of Engineers Agreement
Mrs. Knieriem made the motion to approve and grant the President of Council permission to sign the cooperation agreement between, the Army Corp of Engineers and the Borough relative to grant funding for the rehabilitation of the Meyersdale Non-Federal Local Flood Protection Project. Mr. Smith seconded. Motion passed.
- ATV Ordinance
PennDOT has not approved the usage of state highways to ATV traffic. They are considering some usage and there will be trails and designated areas that can be used. The Borough should think about making paths and trails, however they are supposed to have full time reviews and patrols of the same. There needs to be a uniform speed limit area, noise needs to be regulated in certain areas. An

amendment to the ordinance should take the businesses into consideration.

- The 326 Salisbury St. property was up for tax sale, however this will not happen. The demolition of the property is expected to proceed and could be started this week.

CODE ENFORCEMENT:

No report was given.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Municipal Authority

Mr. Witherite reported that every employee of the Meyersdale Municipal Authority is dedicated to finding the solution to the discoloring of the water situation. This is a perplexing situation, tests have been completed and the results are all coming back okay. The MMA has been working with outside sources to find a solution. It was assured that the water is safe for drinking.

The MMA Board is working on projects to be in compliance with the Corrective Action Plan and have been working with public officials for grant funding. They continue to be proactive for the future.

Street Foreman

No report was given.

Meyersdale Area Merchants Association

- A new board has been formed.
- The Farmers Market is going amazingly.
- The annual golf outing fundraiser will be held on August 23, 2025.

Public Library

No report was given.

Meyersdale Community Events Committee

Jeff Christner organized the Concert in the Park. Approximately 75 people were in attendance. The Corner Cup was open and sold food items.

Haley Belardi will be performing in the gazebo on August 31, 2025.

Meyersdale Renaissance Committee

No report was given.

COUNCIL MEMBERS – STANDING COMMITTEES:

Police/Public Safety

- Police mini split system
Council decided to hold off selling the unit until they can make sure if can be used elsewhere.

Personnel

Mrs. Knieriem asked when the job descriptions will be discussed for the streets crew. President Irwin reported that it had been decided to hold discussion on this matter until it is time for contract negotiations. Those negotiations should begin sometime in early 2026.

Finance

No report was given.

Refuse

An agreement has not been received from Harbaugh Trucking for the refuse contract extension.

Streets/Buildings

No report was given.

Flood Control

It was reported that DEP suggested doing a change of scope for a \$225,000.00 grant that was received for the flood control rip rap project. A request was sent to Senator Stefano to ask for a change order to use the funds for the cleaning of the debris basin rather than the rip rap. President Irwin read a text message he received from Senator Stefano that he would not have an update until after the state budget has been passed.

Farmer's Market

No report was given.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

A.) Estimate to repair/upgrade uptown cameras

Mrs. Knieriem made the motion to have the uptown security cameras repaired. Mr. Smith seconded. Motion passed.

B.) ADA family restroom and grant application

- Engineer updated drawings for family restroom placement in the ladies room area. Two options were given. (See attached drawings) One option is for the entry door to be facing the main entrance vestibule and the other option is for the entry door to be facing an existing hall corridor.

Mr. Ackerman made the motion to choose the plan with the entrance to the family restroom from the hallway corridor and to utilize part of the ladies restroom and the janitorial room for the project. Mr. Smith seconded. Roll Call Vote: Mr. Ackerman – Yes; Mr. Baer – Yes; Mr. Baker – Absent; Mrs. Gnagey – Absent; Mr. Irwin – Yes; Mrs. Knieriem – Yes; Mr. Smith – Yes. Motion passed.

C.) Zoning Ordinance Review

This item was tabled until the October 2025 committee meeting.

D.) Discuss PEMA property buyouts

It was suggested to make contact with PEMA and meet with them on this issue.

Mrs. Knieriem made the motion to appoint an alternate Board Member, Sarah Jones to fill the position until July 2027. Mr. Smith seconded. Motion passed.

Mrs. Gnagey had requested this item to be placed on the Agenda. Due to her absence there was no discussion. This item will be placed on the Agenda for the September 2025 meeting.

D.) Grants

Mrs. Gnagey had requested this item be placed on the Agenda. Due to her absence there was no discussion. This item will be placed on the Agenda for the September 2025 meeting.

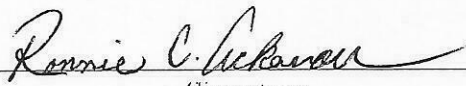

My conflict/reason for abstaining is as follows:

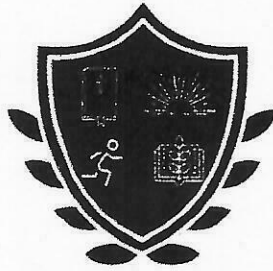

NOTE: Section 1103 (J) requires the following procedure:

"Any public official or public employee, who in the discharge of his official duties, would be required to vote on a matter that would result in a conflict of interest shall abstain from voting and, prior to the vote being taken, publicly announce and disclose the nature of his interest as a public record in a written memorandum filed with the person responsible for recording the minutes for the meeting at which the vote is taken...."

(Please note that State Ethics Commission required a public official to complete a form every time he has a conflict of interest).

What courses are being offered?

For the 2025-2026 school year we are only offering physical education. This is usually a class that is hard to participate in when you only have your own children in the class. What does the logo represent?

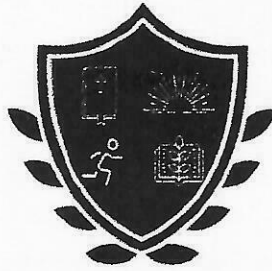

OPEN PUBLIC COMMENT POLICY/VISITOR PARTICIPATION POLICY (REVISED 2/13/2024)

As a governmental body, the Borough Council has a variety of responsibilities and recognizes their responsibilities to obtain and the benefits to be received from public comments on matters pending before the Council. To provide an orderly and efficient manner to obtain public comment and to provide the public with an opportunity to participate in the meetings of the Borough, the Council hereby adopts the following policy for public comment.

I. OPEN PUBLIC COMMENT.

- A. So as to permit the Borough Council to complete their regular business in a timely fashion, an open public comment period not to exceed thirty (30) minutes shall be provided shortly after the opening of each advertised, regular Borough meeting. In the event that the open public comment period exceeds thirty (30) minutes, any member of the Borough Council may bring to the attention of the Council President that the time period has been exceeded and the time period may thereafter be extended only upon majority vote of the Borough Council members present.
- B. Public comment shall be primarily for residents of Meyersdale Borough, Somerset County, Pennsylvania. Non-residents shall be permitted to speak only if no residents are present or if there is additional time remaining during the public comment period. All persons addressing the Board must identify themselves and give their current residence address.
- C. So as to permit maximum public comment and input, no individual speaker shall be permitted to speak for more than five (5) minutes regardless of the topic and at no time may be transferred or assigned by others to the speakers so as to extend the five (5) minute time limit.
- D. It shall not be the normal practice of the Borough council to give responses or answers to issues or questions raised during the open public comment period, either by the Council members or by employees of the Borough. Any questions or issues raised will be referred to the appropriate individual for review and response. This provision shall not preclude the Council members from responding to questions requiring brief answers or information.
- E. In the event that persons shall wish to address the Borough Council requiring additional time beyond the thirty (30) minute open public comment period, the Council President or the Council member chairing the meeting in the absence of the Council President may either defer public comment until the end of the regular agenda for an additional public

comment period not to exceed sixty (60) minutes or may schedule a special or subsequent meeting for the purpose of obtaining additional public comment.

- F. Public comment may be stopped at the discretion of the Council President or the Council member chairing the meeting in the absence of the Council President, if defamatory or slanderous comments are made and additional comment by the speaker may be disallowed. Any member of Borough Council may request a vote of the Council to override the decision of the Council President or the Council member in charge, to permit additional comment by the speaker.

II. VISITOR PARTICIPATION – AGENDA.

- A. Any person or group wishing to appear before the Borough Council as a part of the regular agenda to present or discuss a major topic or issue shall deliver to the office of the Borough a written request to be placed on the agenda at least two (2) weeks (fourteen [14] days) prior to the scheduled meeting. Each such request for inclusion as a part of the agenda shall include the following:

1. Name and address of person making the request.
2. Organization or group, if any, represented.
3. Content of information to be presented. If written material is to be passed out, a copy must accompany the request.
4. Specific subject to be discussed or specific questions to be asked.
5. If any information is to be presented that is in the form of statements or charges that might be considered derogatory, or of another serious nature, such must be presented in writing, specifically stating the charges and made in affidavit form.

- B. The Borough Council President shall respond in writing to any person or group making such an agenda item request, informing them as to the date of the meeting at which time the presentation may be made and the place assigned on the agenda. In the event that the agenda for the next ensuing meeting is unduly long, the Council President may, in the President's discretion, place the request for presentation at a subsequent meeting. In the event a question should arise in regard to granting such an agenda item request, the matter shall be referred to the entire Borough Council for decision. In no event shall any request be postponed for more than one (1) regular meeting.

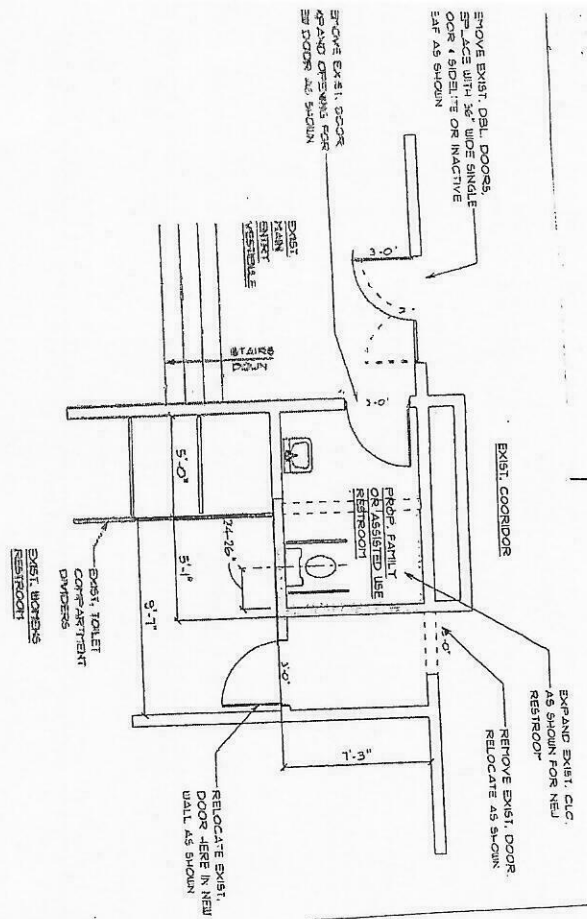
- C. The Council President or his designee shall furnish a copy of such agenda request, verbatim, to each Council member with the agenda so that there will be ample time to study the matter.

- D. In the event that the subject matter of the agenda request shall appropriately involve an investigation or additional information, the Council President or his designee shall undertake to make such arrangements to obtain additional information and shall provide a written report of such information or recommendation sufficiently in advance of the meeting so the Council members shall have an ample opportunity to review the material.
- E. No person or group shall be allotted more than the thirty (30) minutes per subject on the agenda for any Borough meeting. A maximum of fifteen (15) minutes shall be allotted to the proponent of a subject or request, of which ten (10) minutes may be used for presentation and the remaining five (5) minutes for questions by the Borough Council members or Borough employees or consultants. Equal time shall be allocated an opponent, if any. If the item involves a group, a responsible party shall be appointed prior to the start of the discussion. If there is more than one speaker on each side of a question, it shall be the responsibility of the discussion leader for each group to divide the ten (10) minute period.

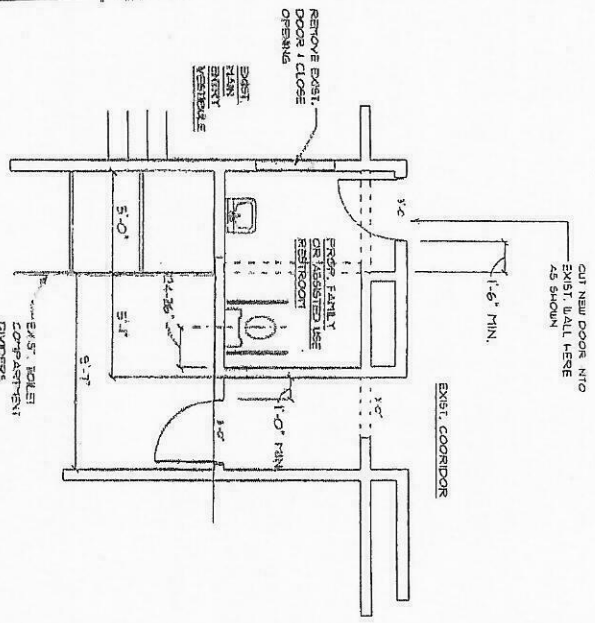
III. REGULAR AGENDA.

The President of the Borough Council or the Council member chairing the meeting in the absence of the Council President may, at his or her discretion, request information or comment from any visitor or person present at the meeting on an agenda item.
