Regular Meeting  
February 10, 2026  
6:00 P.M.

The regular monthly meeting of the Meyersdale Borough Council was called to order by President Irwin, February 10, 2026 at 6:00 P.M.

Mr. Baer, Mr. Christner, Mrs. Gnagey, Mr. Irwin, Mr. Munion, Mr. Smith, and Solicitor Valentine were present. Mr. Ackerman was present via telephone. Mayor Smith and Olivia Baker, Junior Council Member were absent. Mr. Brion Reiber, Street Foreman was also present.

**MINUTES:**

Mr. Gnagey noted an error on the minutes. On page 2 under Committee Reports, bullet point two, item 3. the following was incorrect: *Senator Stefano* should be removed and Mr. Steve Spochart, Somerset County Redevelopment Authority should be added.

Mr. Baer made the motion to approve the minutes of the January 5, 2026 Reorganization Meeting with the correction. Mr. Smith seconded. Motion passed.

**AUDIT REPORT:**

Mrs. Kyla Pritts from Beer Ream & Company was present to give an overview of the 2025 Audit Report. Mr. Munion made the motion to accept the 2025 Audit Report. Mr. Baer seconded. Motion passed.

President Irwin asked Mrs. Gnagey what the status was of her request for financial information she had received through a right to know request. Mrs. Gnagey reported that they have not gotten through all of the information.

**FINANCIAL REPORT/ BILLS:**

Mr. Baer presented a financial report that included a breakdown of account balances and monthly bill totals for the major accounts.

Other items:

- Ambulance Cost share  
Mr. Smith made the motion to authorize payment of \$10,828.66 from the LST account for the Borough cost share for ambulance services. Mrs. Gnagey seconded. Motion passed. This payment is to be made immediately.
- Emergency Management Coordinator stipend - \$1,000.00  
Mrs. Gnagey made the motion to authorize payment of a \$1,000.00 stipend to Mr. Kevin Broadwater, Emergency Management Coordinator. Mr. Smith seconded. Motion passed. This payment is to be made immediately.
- Donations to be given after tax revenue (March/April)  
Meyersdale Fire Department  
Mrs. Gnagey made the motion to increase the donation to the Fire Department from \$1,000.00 to \$5,000.00. Mr. Smith seconded. Motion passed.  
Meyersdale Public Library  
Mrs. Gnagey made the motion to authorize payment of \$1,000.00 to the Public Library. Mr. Smith seconded.

### Transfer to Flood Control

Mrs. Gnagey made the motion to authorize a transfer of \$10,000.00 from the General Fund to the Flood Control account. Mr. Christner seconded. Motion passed.

- **Electric Bills**

Mrs. Gnagey reported that she completed research through First Energy and found that First Energy is willing to convert the street lights to LED at no charge to the Borough. (See attached report)

Mrs. Gnagey made the motion to make application and sign an agreement with First Energy to convert all of the street lights to LED per the recommendation of First Energy. Mr. Smith seconded. Motion passed.

- **PennDOT request regarding Center Street repairs.**

The attached e-mail from PennDOT was presented. After discussion, Council decided to table action on this matter until after they could look at the site and ascertain if it needs done.

- **Authorized signers on bank accounts**

The Secretary reported that in order to update bank account signature cards, the banks are requesting that the meeting minutes specify who is being removed, added and retained on the accounts as authorized signers.

Mr. Munion made the motion to remove Virginia Knieriem and Terry Baker, add Thomas Smith and Clarence S. Baer, and to retain Jeff Irwin, DDS and Patricia C. Ackerman as authorized signers on Borough bank accounts.

Mr. Baer made the motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills as presented. Mr. Smith seconded. Motion passed.

### **GUESTS:**

A.) Mrs. Connie Anderson from the Maple City Garden Club was present to report that upgrades and or replacement of the planters and tub liners are apparent. The liner tubs are not deep enough to keep the the plants adequately watered and some of the planters are in rough shape. After some discussion, Council decided to have the Garden Club obtain estimates for both upgrading the tub liners and to have the planters rebuilt and report back to Council at the March 10, 2026 meeting.

B.) Ms. Rebekah Walter was pre-registered as a guest, but was unable to attend the meeting.

The Secretary reported that Ms. Walter was wanting to use the playground for soccer instruction classes. Council indicated that she would be able to hold those classes, but would need to provide a certificate of insurance.

### **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

Mr. Robert Spochart was present to report that he had asked two years ago to have a traffic mirror placed between Colonial St. & Dale Street, and that Council had agreed to install one, however the mirror has never been installed. Mr. Reiber was asked to meet with Mr. Spochart to get an idea of the type and size mirror that is needed and to order the same and get it installed.

Mr. Spochart also suggested that a mirror be installed at Dale Street and Center Street. No action was taken regarding this request.

### **PRESIDENT'S REPORT:**

No report was given.

**MAYOR'S REPORT:**

Mrs. Gnagey presented the police report in the absence of Mayor Smith.

It was reported that the police are in need of 2 vests at an estimated cost of \$2,900.00.

Mrs. Gnagey made the motion to purchase two vests. Mr. Christner seconded. Motion passed.

Mrs. Gnagey reported that she is working with a business who may sponsor the cost of the vests.

Mrs. Gnagey reported that Chris Harbaugh did the fireworks display for Light up Night. Mayor Smith is interested in getting a quote from him to do the display for Independence Day.

Mr. Baer and Mr. Christner were asked to contact Mr. Harbaugh and get a written quote for presentation at the March 10, 2026 meeting.

**JUNIOR COUNCIL REPORT:**

No report was given.

**EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR:**

Mr. Kevin Broadwater reported on the following:

The deadline for financial loss support with the SBA is approaching.

The Emergency Operations Plan will expire and that Council should review the plan and get it completed by the September deadline.

Council is encouraged to take the FEMA online training classes. The classes can be taken on the FEMA website. Mr. Munion was interested in taking the classes. Mr. Broadwater will provide the information.

There is a concern with ice jams when the snow begins to melt.

**ENGINEER'S REPORT:**

No report was given.

**SOLICITOR'S REPORT:**

Solicitor Valentine reported on the following:

326 Salisbury St. Settlement Statement

Mrs. Gnagey made the motion to approve the Settlement Statement for the sale of the 326 Salisbury St. property. Mr. Christner seconded. Motion passed.

618-622 Grant St. property sale

A closing date has been set to settle this sale.

351 Meyers Avenue

Solicitor Valentine reached out to Mr. Gallagher regarding the sale of this property. The best way to handle the issue with the road is to layout a right of way in the deed.

Mrs. Gnagey made the motion to accept the bid from Mr. Robert Gallagher to purchase the property. Mr. Smith seconded. Motion passed.

221 Salisbury St.

Solicitor Valentine will file the necessary paperwork with the Judge to proceed with this property.

Eric Minnick issue

This matter was turned over to the insurance carrier. It is most likely that the Borough will not be responsible for the damages due to the Immunity Act. The Meyersdale Municipal Authority is doing the same.

Wright litigation

There was no additional report. Solicitor Valentine will be asking the Judge to dismiss the case.

Kyle litigation

This case was settled through the insurance carrier.

Snow Ordinance

A draft snow ordinance will be prepared and distributed to Council for review.

High Street Bridge

The bridge has structural issues. Solicitor recommends reaching out to local officials for assistance. Mr. Christner made the motion to have Solicitor Valentine reach out to State Representative Metzgar and Senator Stefano. Mr. Baer seconded. Motion passed.

Zoning Board Hearing

A zoning hearing was held December 29, 2025 and a request to locate a daycare in an R-1 district was denied.

Occupation Tax Ordinance

The occupation tax ordinance must be re-done due to the fact that the maximum that can be charged is \$10.00. Mr. Munion made the motion to authorize the Solicitor to proceed with preparation and advertising a new occupation ordinance. Mr. Baer seconded. Motion passed.

Brown's mobile home park

There was an issue regarding a mobile home park that was once in existence on Thomas Street. Per the zoning ordinance, since the property was not used as a mobile home park for more than 1 year, it will be necessary for Mr. Brown to go through the process and follow the mobile home and zoning ordinance.

**CODE ENFORCEMENT:**

No report was given.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

Municipal Authority

No report was given by the MMA.

Street Foreman

Mr. Reiber reported on the following:

- Sell Street/Road Sweeper  
Mr. Smith made the motion to put the Tennant street/road sweeper out for bid. Mrs. Gnagey seconded. Motion passed. The equipment will be listed for sale AS IS and with no warranty or guarantee.
- The John Deere tractor is over 30 years old and is not working as it should.  
After some discussion, Mr. Reiber was to obtain quotes on a new or used tractor and quotes on retrofitting the Steiner with necessary equipment to blow snow.

Mrs. Gnagey asked about the following:

Microwave and gutters for pavilion

Microwave has been purchased and is ready for installation.

Mr. Reiber was given permission to get quotes on the cost to install gutters on the pavilion.

Snow removal on sidewalks along Grant St.

The question was specifically the sidewalk above the playground and the sidewalk along the community center adjacent to business 219. It was reported that this is the responsibility of the Borough and that the crew attempted to clear the same, but it has become hardened and difficult to remove without the proper equipment.

Handicap sign at post office

Mrs. Gnagey reported that there is no sign there. Mr. Reiber was instructed to install a handicap parking sign.

Line painting

Mrs. Gnagey suggested keeping the lines painted at the Monument. Drivers do not know which way to go at this location. She also suggested having a divide line on the roadway at the stop sign coming down Meyers Avenue. Solicitor Valentine was not sure if a guide line is permissible.

Meyersdale Area Merchants Association/Farmers Market

Mr. Brian Berkebile reported on the following:

The Farmers Market is scheduled for each Thursday from June through September with a tentative time being 8 AM – 2 PM. Mrs. Gnagey made the motion to grant the Meyersdale Area Merchants Association permission to use the pavilion for the Farmers Market. Mr. Christner seconded. Motion passed.

A grant was approved to replace the Ladybird Johnson billboard in Summit Township. There will be an estimated \$2,400.00 match. He has some businesses lined up to cover the match, however they would like to be recognized for their sponsorship on the billboard, which may not be permitted. Solicitor Valentine indicated that there are ways to get around this restriction. Solicitor Valentine is willing to assist in the process.

The next MAMA meeting is scheduled for February 18, 2026 and will be held at the Elks Lodge.

Public Library

Mrs. Gnagey reported that the annual Death by Chocolate fundraiser will be held at the Amity Church basement on February 13, 2026. She encouraged everyone to attend and support the Library.

Lien on property

It was reported that the Library is in the process of purchasing a property from the Apostolic Church and there is a lien for sidewalk repairs on the property. The lien dates back to 2010 when the street scape project was completed. Mr. Smith made the motion to grant Solicitor Valentine permission to satisfy the lien. Mr. Baer seconded. Motion passed.

Meyersdale Community Events Committee

Mr. Christner presented a budget of \$7,000.00 for events to be held for 2026. After some discussion, Mr. Baer made the motion to approve a budget of \$8,000.00 for the 2026 year. Mr. Munion seconded. Motion passed. The majority of the funding will come from the Frank Lucente Fund.

Mr. Christner reported that Marlana Marker has resigned as an events committee volunteer. Solicitor Valentine reported that anyone willing to volunteer can be chosen to replace Mrs. Marker.

The Community Events Committee meeting will be held February 26, 2026 at 7 PM at the Elks Club.

Mrs. Gnagey thanked First Summit Bank for the donation of a new Christmas tree for the gazebo. It was reported that a thank you letter had been sent to Mr. Michael Paulman acknowledging the donation.

Mrs. Gnagey reported that new garland is needed for the gazebo. Mrs. Gnagey made the motion to purchase garland for the gazebo at a cost of up to \$800 with funds from the Leckemby Account. Mr. Christner seconded. Motion passed.

#### Meyersdale Renaissance Committee

This committee report was to be removed from the Agenda.

#### COUNCIL MEMBERS – STANDING COMMITTEES:

##### Police/Public Safety

President Irwin asked that Council come up with a plan which would allow access to the police department in an emergency. President Irwin suggested having a key in the Borough office that could be signed out when needed. Solicitor Valentine did not see an issue, because the evidence room is locked, the computers are password protected and there could be detailed documentation of entry with a paper trail and notice to the Mayor. Mrs. Gnagey suggested tabling this until the Mayor was present.

##### Personnel

No report was given.

##### Finance

No report was given.

##### Refuse

The updated refuse contract was to be listed on the Agenda. The current contract extension expires 1/1/2027 and there is an option for two additional extensions. It was also reported that Harbaugh Trucking may be requesting an increase in the monthly hauling fees due to the possibility of landfill rates increasing in April 2026.

##### Streets/Buildings

Solicitor Valentine reported that decisions on the types of materials, fixtures, etc that will be wanted for the ADA restroom, need to be made before he can let it out for bid. Every contractor needs to be bidding on the same specific products. After some discussion, Mrs. Gnagey volunteered to put together the specifications for the project.

##### Flood Control

Mrs. Gnagey reported that she had been in contact with Nicole Weaver from State Representative Metzgar's office in an attempt to get the \$225,000.00 DCED grant reallocated for use to clean the flood control debris basin.

The Secretary reported that an e-mail was received from DCED indicating the approval was granted. A hard copy of the e-mail was placed at each Council members seat prior to the meeting. A thank you letter will be sent to State Representative Metzgar and Senator Stefano for their assistance with getting the reallocation.

**Liaison to Flood Control Committee**

Mr. Christner made the motion to appoint Mr. Terry Baker as a liaison to the Flood Control Committee. Mr. Baer seconded. Motion passed.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

A.) Zoning Ordinance Review

A meeting will be scheduled at a later date. The meeting will be exclusively for Zoning Ordinance review.

B.) Donation of illuminated Bethlehem stars

Mr. Smith made the motion to accept the donation of 7 illuminated Bethlehem stars from a local Church. Mr. Baer seconded. Motion passed.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

A.) Announcements

There were no announcements.

B.) Vacancy on Uniform Construction Code of Appeals Board

Mr. Irwin made the motion to appoint Mr. Keith Hay to fill the vacancy on the Uniform Construction Code of Appeals Board. Mr. Christner seconded. Motion passed. Mr. Hay will serve until July 2027.

C.) Notifications

It was decided to utilize the Meyersdale Municipal Authority All Call system to notify residents of trash pickup changes, snow emergency notices, etc.

**GOALS FOR THE CURRENT YEAR**

A.) Flood Control rip rap – No discussion

B.) 3-5 year goal plan

Mrs. Gnagey reported that she would like to set a three to five year goal plan, so that Steve Spochart and Michelle Beener could meet with Council and discuss availability of grants and application process for grants and funding sources.

Council set the following goals:

- Community Center improvements
- Update equipment
- 250<sup>th</sup> celebration
- 40ft. flag pole
- Increase in police protection
- Storm drain review, mapping and cleaning
- Police SUV

- Move location of Police station to either within the borough shed or as an addition to the borough shed building.

Mrs. Gnagey asked what was happening with the old mini split that was taken from the police department. She has someone who is interested in buying it. There was some discussion about installing it in the pavilion. No decision was made.

Mr. Munion reported that he attended the newly elected official training and a meeting regarding the 250<sup>th</sup> celebration planning.

Mrs. Gnagey reported that the Somerset County Borough Association dinner meeting will be held at the Somerset Country Club on March 17, 2026.

Mr. Irwin asked the Secretary to furnish the Contract Negotiation Committee with a copy of the current Non Uniform Union contract.

The Secretary was given permission to purchase a first aid kit for the Community Center.

**ADDITIONAL ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION**

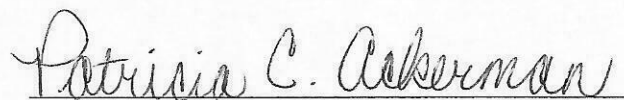

On the individual bills, the price to compare is found to the left on the bill and looks like below.

Your current **PRICE TO COMPARE** for generation and transmission from Penelec is listed below. For you to save, a supplier's price must be lower.

**General Secondary Medium - 0007437913 - 12.16 cents per KWH**

Streetlight bill account 100109404630 – If you take the Generation related component on the bill (\$1,533.13) and divide it by the total kWh's (25,542), you get the average cost per kWh to compare (6 cents per kWh). Our current PTC is 12.15 cents per kWh so this is a good rate.

On another note, due to manufacturers shifting production from sodium vapor and other traditional streetlights to LED. Non-LED streetlights will no longer be available after 12/31/2025. FirstEnergy Pennsylvania (FE PA) Electric Company will convert all company-owned, non-LED streetlights to LED streetlights at no cost to customers throughout its Pennsylvania service areas **over the next four years**. This follows the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PAPUC) approval of a new LED Conversion Charge (LEDC) as part of FE PA's new base rates that took effect Jan. 1, 2025.

**Benefits:** LED streetlights provide advantages over traditional lighting:

- Longer life span – projected 50,000+ hours
- Greater energy efficiency
- Brighter illumination to improve public safety
- Lower streetlight bills and reduced maintenance costs – **your generation supply charges would be reduced with the reduction in wattage per streetlight.**
- Sharper, downward directed light to minimize light pollution
- Better reliability minimizing streetlight outages

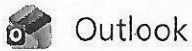
To prepare for the conversion, Meyersdale Borough will need to do the following:

1. Sign and return the attached Meyersdale Borough LED streetlighting agreement.
2. Decide what size lights you want installed. Attached are the General Electric replacement recommendations that are normally followed unless you want to increase light levels at any location.

Our records indicate that Meyersdale Borough is currently being billed for the following streetlights on account 100109404630:

- 178 – 100 watt HPS wood pole (current rate of \$10.49 per streetlight) – GE Recommendation is 50 watt LED (rate of \$9.37 per streetlight)
- 45 – 150 watt HPS wood pole (current rate of \$9.97 per streetlight) – GE Recommendation is 90 watt LED (rate of \$11.16 per streetlight)
- 4 - 400 watt HPS wood pole (current rate of \$10.46 per streetlight) – GE Recommendation is 260 watt LED but these lights are really bright, and we have had some complaints, so a 130 watt LED maybe a better choice (rate of \$12.59 per streetlight)

3. Identify any streetlights that you no longer want so they can be removed prior to the conversion. Once converted, they will be under the new 10-year agreement and there would be a remaining life cost to remove them.
4. We also can provide 3000K and 4000K LED streetlights, so let us know if you have a preference. Price is the same for both.

**Message**

Good Morning,

My Name is Dale Bihun, I am an Assistant County Maintenance Manager with PennDOT in Somerset. I have been monitoring the condition of SR 2006 (Main Street) at the intersection of Center Street for some time.

I would like to place some blacktop patches with a paver on each approach of the intersection. However, to do this there are two things that I would need the council to agree on. One, the brick stamped crosswalks on the approach lanes to this intersection would be milled out and not replaced. The remarking of the crosswalks would be the responsibility of the Borough. The other more critical factor to doing this work are the loop sensors for the traffic lights. After the work was completed the Borough would have to hire a contractor reinstall the loop sensors in the new blacktop. We did recently perform this type of repair per the request of Jenner Township this summer at the intersection of SR 601 and Route 30. If it is something that the council is willing to consider, Jenner Township may be able to provide some information on a vendor and associated costs.

If the council does not want to proceed with this type of repair, I will do my best to perform some manual patching in this area to attempt to address the roadway deterioration at the above location. Please let me know what the council decides on this topic. If you wish to discuss this issue, please feel free to contact me via email, or phone. My current work schedule is 4am to noon during the winter months.
