

Ordinance # 322 DOG BARKING ORDINANCE REPEALED

ORDINANCE NO. 322

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL ORDINANCE NO. 292

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Borough of Meyersdale, and it is hereby ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the authority of the same:

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Meyersdale passed an Ordinance dated June 9, 1980, after determining that barking dogs and dogs running loose and not properly attended had become a nuisance to the people of the Borough of Meyersdale and as such notice must be regulated and controlled;

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Meyersdale has determined that said Ordinance is unnecessary because the Borough Council has sufficient authority under the Pennsylvania Borough Code to control said barking dogs and dogs running loose and not properly attended, and that said Ordinance is costly and extremely difficult to enforce, and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Meyersdale has therefore determined that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the Borough to repeal said Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND IT IS HEREBY ENACTED and ORDAINED as follows:

Section 1: Ordinance No. 292, dated June 9, 1980 is hereby repealed.

Section 2: All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
